

## Influenza update

Influenza cases have increased significantly in recent weeks.

All residential care facilities should be **activating their influenza preparedness plans** and ensuring their **outbreak response plans** are ready to activate as needed.

Follow these key messages:

- Ensure all your **residents and staff** have had their **FREE** influenza vaccine and are up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations for 2024.
- Exclude staff and visitors when sick.
- Be vigilant for infected residents and implement outbreak response plans early.
- Ensure resident orders for antivirals are current, as appropriate.
- If residents are unwell, isolate and cohort from other residents.
- Ensure staff and residents are cleaning their hands regularly and practicing good respiratory hygiene.
- Regularly clean frequently touched surfaces.
- Ensure good ventilation for residents and staff.
- Contact your local Public Health Unit if you have an influenza outbreak in your facility and follow their advice.
