# Psychiatrist (Chapter 4) reports for people in custody

There will be occasions where a person who is the subject of a psychiatrist report is in Queensland Corrective Services (QCS) custody. In these cases, the examination interview for the person may need to occur via videoconference.

## **Examination of a person in custody**

Videoconference bookings are equivalent to an in-person visit within a QCS facility. As such, security clearance under s155 and s156 of the *Corrective Services Act 2006* is required.

This is acquired by completing the QCS Form 27(a) - <u>Application to Visit (In Person/Virtual)</u> - Professional, Official or Other Business Purposes.

QCS completes criminal record checks upon receiving the Form 27(a) and processing time may vary up to 8 weeks. Once approved, this form remains valid for 12 months and information is stored securely by QCS.

Videoconferences can only be booked once an Application to Visit has been approved by OCS.

#### Tips for completing the Form 27(a) - Application to Visit

- Work address and contact details can be utilised.
- Select all modes of visit to ensure repeat applications are not required within 12 months should your visit mode change.
- Request access to 'All Centres' not a specific centre.
- Provide a photo of your valid Queensland Health identification card. This does not need to be certified.
- Save a copy of your completed form, this will make reapplication easier after 12 months has elapsed.

#### Booking a videoconference

As every QCS facility has its own booking system, <u>contact the prison</u> for details.

When booking a videoconference for an examination for a psychiatrist report, you need to clearly state that it is for a medicolegal purpose and that you require 60 minutes (or longer) to complete the examination.





It is also recommended that you provide QCS with several possible dates and indicate your availability on those dates (i.e. AM/PM or both). This will assist QCS to book the earliest possible appointment for you as the person's custodial security status (i.e. mainstream vs. protection) may mean they can only be seen on certain days due to operational restrictions within the centre.
