



Facts on water fluoridation in Queensland

- 67 per cent of Queensland children have experienced tooth decay by eight years of age.
- Every year, around 2000 pre-schoolers need to be hospitalised for severe dental decay.
- O Fluoride is a naturally occurring compound found in water, plants, rocks, soil, air and foods.
- O Topping up fluoride levels in water can reduce the risk of dental decay by up to 40 per cent.
- O Prior to 2008, only five per cent of Queenslanders had access to fluoridated drinking water while other states and territories have been fluoridated for 30-50 years.
- O The Department of Health no longer recommends the routine use of fluoride supplements, as they do not provide the same health benefit as fluoridated water, and may increase the risk of dental fluorosis.

Safety and cost-effectiveness of water fluoridation

- O A recent review found an average of 2.25 less decayed teeth per child in fluoridated areas.
- Numerous studies and reviews have confirmed the effectiveness of water financiation in reducing dental decay for the whole population.
- O The fluoridation of public water supplies has been practised around the world for more than sixty years; it is acknowledged as one of the 10 greatest public health achievements of the 20th century.
- A recent national review of water fluoridation found no negative health effects and only a slight increase in dental fluorosis.
- Water fluoridation gives extra protection against tooth decay but a healthy diet, regular brushing and flossing and regular dental check-ups are all essential for good oral health.
- More than 150 major health organisations including the World Health Organization, the Australian Medical Association (AMA), and the Australian Dental Association (ADA) support water fluoridation.

fluoride

Myth: Fluoride causes cancer

Fact Scientific studies from around the world have failed to demonstrate a link between water fluoridation and any type of cancer.

Fact Cancer rates in the rest of Australia (mostly fluoridated for decades) are no higher than in Queensland (largely non-fluoridated until 2008).

Myth: Fluoride causes allergies

Fact Fluoride is found naturally in most foods and water.

Fact Reviews by peak health bodies around the world show no connection between water fluoridation and allergies, hypersensitivity or other immunological effects.

Myth: Fluoride causes arthritis

Fact The incidence of arthritis is no different in fluoridated and non-fluoridated communities, and there has never been any evidence from doctors, let alone published studies, suggesting this.

Fact Arthritis Australia has endorsed water fluoridation, stating that "Arthritis Australia is in favour of water fluoridation. There is no reputable scientific evidence that water fluoridation causes or worsens symptoms of arthritis".

Myth: Water fluoridation is banned in Europe

Fact No country has banned water fluoridation.

Fact Many countries use salt fluoridation as an alternative.

Myth: Fluoride causes bone fractures

Fact All Australian capital cities (except Brisbane) have been fluoridated for decades and have not seen an increase in bone fractures or other ill effects. Water fluoridation has been endorsed by Osteoporosis Australia.

Myth: Water fluoridation is bad for babies

Fact Water fluoridation has been endorsed by the World Health Organization,
Australian Medical Association and American Academy of Pediatrics, and poses no known health risks for babies and young children.

Myth: Infant formula contains high levels of fluoride when mixed with fluoridated water

Fact Recent Australian studies show no link between the use of infant formulas and dental fluorosis.

Fact Fluoridated water can be safely used to reconstitute Infant formula.

Myth: Water fluoridation causes excessive dental fluorosis

The only known side effect of optimal water fluoridation is a slight increase in dental fluorosis levels.

Fact Most fluorosis is barely detectable and does not damage the teeth, whereas tooth decay is painful, unsightly and expensive to repair.

Myth: Water fluoridation is mass medication

Fact The Department of Health does not consider the addition of fluoride to drinking water to be 'mass medication', but simply adjusting the level of a substance already found naturally in the water to provide a substantial public health benefit.

Frequently asked QUESTIONS

Q: What is fluoride?

A: Fluoride is a naturally occurring compound found in water, plants, rocks, soil, air and most foods.

Q: Why is fluoride added to the water?

A: While water supplies naturally contain some level of fluoride, there is not always sufficient fluoride to prevent tooth decay, especially when the water source comes from above the ground.

Q: What benefits could water fluoridation have for me and my family?

A: Water fluoridation helps to protect adults and children from tooth decay. It provides additional protection to fluoridated toothpaste. Preventing tooth decay can save your family the pain and discomfort of toothache and the expense required to treat the disease.

Q: Is water fluoridation poisonous?

A: No, water fluoridation is not poisonous. Anything can be dangerous at very high levels, but fluoride at less than one part per million is extremely safe.

Q: Does water fluoridation cause cancer or bone damage?

A: No, water fluoridation is not harmful, and numerous studies have found it does not cause cancer, osteoporosis, bone fractures or any other disease. Rates of any disease are no higher in fluoridated areas than in non fluoridated areas.

Q: Does water fluoridation cause allergic reactions?

A: No, water fluoridation has not been proven to cause any allergic reactions. Reviews by peak health bodies around the world have found no connection between water fluoridation and allergies, hypersensitivity or other immunological effects. Even sea water contains more fluoride than the levels in fluoridated water.

Q: Does water fluoridation affect the taste or smell of water?

A: No, fluoride does not affect the taste or smell of water.

Q: Does water fluoridation have any side effects?

A: Dental fluorosis or mottling of the teeth can occur if young children get too much fluoride when their adult teeth are forming.

This condition affects only a small proportion of children and is associated with excess consumption of fluoride from all sources, especially toothpaste or fluoride supplements. Most fluorosis is mild and only detectable by a dentist.

Q: Is it possible for my family to drink too much fluoridated water?

A: Fluoridated water contains less than one part per million of fluoride. The level is set lower in Queensland than other areas of Australia because we need to drink more water due to our hofter climate. Because such a small amount of fluoride is used to top up natural levels, large amounts of water can be safely consumed.

Q: Is it fair to make everybody drink fluoridated water? Why don't people who want fluoride use fluoride supplements?

A: One of the advantages of water fluoridation is it allows all members of the community to benefit from the protective effects of fluoride, without cost or effort. Fluoride supplements do not provide the same benefit as water fluoridation.

Q: What if I really don't want it?

A: Those who choose not to benefit from water fluoridation can still choose other drinking water sources (e.g. bottled water, reverse osmosis filtered water).

Q: Will the Government be offering rebates for water filters?

A: The Government does not subsidise reverse osmosis water filters for those who choose not to access fluoridated water. Reverse osmosis systems are available from water filter retailers and selected hardware stores.

Thank you for your letter to the Honourable Mark McArdle MP. Minister for Energy and Water Supply, dated 7 January 2014, regarding Redland City Council water fluoridation, which has been referred to me for attention.

I very much appreciate you taking the time to share Redland City Council's views on water fluoridation. In progressing amendments to the Water Fluoridation Act 2008, to provide local governments with the ability to determine if it is in the best interest of their communities to implement, continue or discontinue water fluoridation, the Government was responding to longstanding calls from local governments for greater autonomy. Though the legislative changes provide for greater autonomy for local governments, and reflects the Government's commitment to local decision making, a decision was made to continue to support water fluoridation as good public health policy.

Dear Minister

I write to inform you and the Queensland Government of a resolution of Redland City Council, passed at Council's last meeting of 2013.

Council unanimously agreed that the responsibility for fluoridation of water supplies lay with the State and not local government. I have enclosed for your information a copy of the media statement issued by Council on the day of the decision.

We acknowledge that fluoridation was forced on councils by the former Labor Government, without consultation with local government and that the current Government inherited this legacy. However, we believe the current Government should have accepted responsibility for the issue rather than dumping the decision in the lap of councils and expecting us to pay to remove fluoride.

As councils do not control the water grid we are unable to even control our own water flows. Neighbouring council decisions also impact on Redland City and we are in many ways at the mercy of others. As you are well aware, the cost of a reverse osmosis plant is prohibitive to a council like Redland City.

Fluoridation of water supplies has always been - and remains - a health issue - and health is a State responsibility.

On this basis, Redland City Council believes the current Queensland Government should decide whether or not fluoride should stay and bear the cost of removing it should councils make that decision on behalf of their communities.

The cost of removing fluoride is prohibitive to councils – an estimated \$32 million in Rediand City's case – so we cannot afford to make the decision, even if our community tells us it does not want fluoride in our water.

Council resolved unanimously to write to the Government and ask it to amend legislation to protect councils from the high costs involved in removing fluoride from water supplies.

I respectfully urge you to lobby your ministerial colleagues to give local government the choice of accepting non-fluoridated water without cost to councils.

Fluoride a State Government responsibility: Council

Redland City Council has passed the decision on fluoridation of the city's water supply back to the State Government.

Mayor Karen Williams said fluoridation was a health issue and as such was the responsibility of the State Government.

"Fluoridation was forced on councils by the former State Government and the current Government should have accepted responsibility for the issue rather than dumping it in the lap of councils and expecting us to pay to remove fluoride," Cr Williams said.

"Fluoridation of water supplies has always been – and remains – a health issue, and health is a State responsibility.

"The former Government mandated fluoride in our water without reference to councils so we believe the current Government should decide whether or not fluoride should stay and bear the cost of removing it should councils make that decision on behalf of their communities.

"The cost of removing fluoride is prohibitive to councils – an estimated \$32 million in Redland City's case – so we cannot afford to make the call, even if our community tells us it wants out of fluoride.

"This is an expense we are not willing to force on ratepayers."

Council today resolved unanimously to write to the Government and ask it to amend legislation to protect councils from the high costs involved in removing fluoride from water supplies.

"We will be asking Energy and Water Supply Minister Mark McArdle to give local government the choice of accepting non-fluoridated water without cost to councils," Cr Williams said.

"This is a controversial issue with arguments for and against."

Media Release: Moratorium on water fluoridation expansion will save 15 million dollars

Open letter to - Premier Campbell Newman, Treasurer Tim Nicholls, Health Minister Lawrence Springborg, Qld MPs, Media and members of the public.

An immediate Moratorium on expansion of water fluoridation would save the Queensland government at least 15 million dollars.

The Queensland government has massive debts.

On the 2nd May The Brisbane Times reported Premier Newman as saying ...

"The bottom line is Queensland is on a financial power dive into the Grand Canyon of financial disasters. This government is going to take all reasonable, necessary steps to pull us out of that."

Premier, within a few weeks, the new Bundaberg Regional Council will have to award a Tender to fluoridate the Council's water supplies. Bundaberg Council will have to expedite this so it can comply with the Dec 2012 deadline set by former Premier Bligh's mandatory fluoridation legislation.

Bundaberg Council has estimated that it will cost in the order of 10 million dollars to build its 11 fluoride dosing plants and an estimated million dollars every year for the ongoing costs. Bundaberg Regional Council serves an estimated population of just under 100,000 residents.





The Water Fluoridation Act 2008 (the Act) and Water Fluoridation Regulation 2008 (the Regulation) commenced on 5 December 2008. The Act mandates fluoridation of all Queensland drinking water schemes supplying more than 1000 persons.

The Queensland Government based its decision to implement water fluoridation on advice provided by peak health authorities such as the National Health and Medical Research Council, the Australian Dental Association, the Australian Medical Association and the World Health Organization. The research considered by these organisations has been through rigorous scientific reviews by qualified researchers and the weight of evidence has consistently found that water fluoridation is a safe and effective method of reducing tooth decay.

Fluoridation of Queensland drinking water supplies brings Queensland into line with all other Australian states and territories which have been implementing drinking water fluoridation for many years.

The Act and Regulation requires 134 drinking water schemes throughout Queensland to be fluoridated within timeframes that range from 31 December 2008 through to 31 December 2012. The implementation of the Queensland Water Fluoridation Program (QWFP) is progressing well with approximately 87% of Queenslanders now in receipt of fluoridated water.

Implementation is complete in south east Queensland and within most regional centres.

Under the Regulation, drinking water providers must follow strict daily monitoring requirements, including water analysis by a prescribed method. Samples of fluoridated water must also be sent to an accredited external laboratory on a monthly basis to ensure quality control of the daily samples. Every three months, the water provider must submit a report to Queensland Health recording the number of fluoride samples taken over the previous quarter, the average fluoride concentration, as well as the maximum and minimum concentrations detected.

There are rigorous standards for the quality of fluoridation chemicals used. In Queensland, water suppliers who fluoridate are required under the *Water Fluoridation Regulation 2008* to ensure the purity of fluoride chemicals by obtaining a batch analysis certificate for each batch obtained. If such a certificate cannot be obtained from the manufacturer/importer or supplier, the water supplier must have the fluoride compound analysed by a laboratory for purity prior to use. Information regarding impurity specifications for fluoride chemicals is prescribed in the Water Fluoridation Code of Practice which can be viewed at http://www.health.qld.gov.au/ph/documents/ehu/fluoride_codepractice.pdf

Queensland Health conducts regular safety audits for all operational fluoridation plants. The most recent audits of fluoridation plants state-wide showed a high level of compliance with safety requirements.

Bundaberg Council has estimated that it will cost in the order of 10 million dollars to build its 11 fluoride dosing plants and an estimated million dollars every year for the ongoing costs. Bundaberg Regional Council serves an estimated population of just under 100,000 residents.

Mt Isa Water Board will also be fluoridating Mt Isa's water supply by Dec 31 this year and has asked the Qld Treasury for \$ 1.7 million to do this. Mt Isa has an estimated population of 22,000 residents.

Other councils that will have to fluoridate their water supplies by end of December this year include - Balonne, Banana, Barcaldine, Burdekin, Cassowary, Carpentaria, Charters Towers, Cloncurry, Cook, Flinders, Isaac, Paroo, Roma, Winton and Toowoomba (completion)

In March 2008, Premier Bligh claimed in Parliament it was going to cost \$35 million dollars to fluoridate all of Queensland. A Freedom of Information search in April 2011 revealed that the costs of building Qld fluoridation plants up until then exceeded \$113 million.

Water fluoridation is not only forced mass medication, it is also extremely wasteful. Considerably less than 1% of fluoridated water is drunk by children - the target consumer.

Water fluoridation is also ineffective. The largest USA child dental health survey ever done showed only a minute difference in tooth decay between children who had lived all their lives in fluoridated compared to non-fluoridated communities. The difference was not clinically significant, nor shown to be statistically significant. (1)

The Australian study Premier Bligh used in a attempt to justify her decision to force fluoridation on Queenslanders was a 1996 comparison of children who had always lived in fluoridated Townsville, to children who had always lived in unfluoridated Brisbane. (2)

There are 128 tooth surfaces in an average child's mouth. The Townsville Brisbane study found an average difference of only 0.23 tooth surfaces less decay out of 128 tooth surfaces, when comparing the permanent teeth of Townsville children with a lifetime of drinking fivoridated water, to the permanent teeth of children who had never consumed fluoridated water.

The Townsville Brisbane study is just one study of many that indicates the in-effectiveness of fluoridation at reducing tooth decay in the teeth that children have for life.

Premier Newman, we ask that you immediately suspend expansion of the water fluoridation program. Premier Bligh's legislation entails costly, unethical mass medication and it is bad law.

In the coming months you will incrementally be provided with evidence why the water fluoridation program should be reviewed and Premier Bligh's legislation repealed.

Until that can happen, for now, we ask that the Queensland government not force any more councils to fluoridate.

Treasurer Tim Nicholls, it will not cost a cent to suspend expansion of the fluoridation program and it will not cost a cent to end fluoridation. It would be really easy to end water fluoridation and it would cost nothing to turn off the fluoride injector pumps.

Premier Newman, Health Minister Springborg and Treasurer Nicholls, suspending any further expansion of water fluoridation in Queensland is not only sensible; it would be a financially responsible action to take.

BRISBANE, Feb 21 AAP - The decision by another Queensland council to remove fluoride from its drinking water has been slammed by federal Health Minister Tania Plibersek.

Fraser Coast is the sixth council in Queensland to make the controversial decision.

Ms Plibersek has challenged Premier Campbell Newman to take control back from regional councils.

"This will mean people will have unnecessary fillings and extractions of teeth down the track," she told AAP.

She said if Mr Newman really did believe in the science behind fluoride, his actions in allowing local councils to decide the matter were bizarre.

"He's allowed councils to take this incredibly irresponsible action. He should act and show some leadership as premier."

In the past Mr Newman has said he "totally, unequivocally" supports fluoridation.

But some members of his Liberal National Party government clearly believe that fluoride is a health risk.

Government MP Jason Woodforth last week said he'd rather spend the rest of his life taking the banned performance enhancing substance IGF-1 than drink fluoridated water.

Fraser Coast Mayor Gerard O'Connell criticised his council for voting on Wednesday to remove fluoride from the water, saying the issue should be decided by the state government.

He supports fluoridating water, citing the overwhelming amount of medical and scientific evidence that it's a safe and sustainable way to reduce tooth decay among the population.

"I voted not to cease fluoridation. I've been defeated," Mr O'Connell told AAP.

TAXPAYERS have been forced to fork out hundreds of thousands of dollars after blunders at Queensland public hospitals left a baby severely brain damaged, a woman unaware she was dying of breast cancer, and a patient without an unnecessarily amoutated leg, new reports show. More than 500 lawsuits were lodged against Queensland Health between July 1, 2010, and December 31, 2012, but fewer than a third were finalised and just nine reached settlements, according to documents obtained by The Sunday Mail under Right to Information laws. The failure to detect a woman's breast cancer resulted in the largest payout, of \$610,000.

Stare down fluoride disinformation

Dear Editor

If we prevent one permanent tooth cavity in a school child, we don't just prevent one filling. We may prevent a whole lifetime of treatment on that tooth.

The 2002 Australian Child Dental Health Survey examined more than 136,000 children across Australia and found that children who drank fluoridated water had significantly less tooth decay than children who didn't.

Fluoridation is one of the few public health measures that not only improves health, but also saves a significant amount of money.

It is the most effective, cheapest and safest way of delivering the benefits of fluoride to the community.

I urge Cooktown residents to look at both sides of the fluoride debate. The entire conspiracy notion is not based on fact.

There is a big difference in expericiture on oral health between a community that has good dental health as a result of fluoridated water, and a community that relies solely on trips to the dentist to maintain a level of dental health because they don't have fluoridated water.

Every respected Australian and international health organisation agrees: ideal fluoride levels in water are very safe, low cost and highly effective.

Most experts agree that fluoridation will result in a 20–40 per cent reduction in decay experience and this reduction is above and beyond the reduction achieved by using fluoride toothpaste alone.

There is a mountain of high-quality research evidence for this.

Fluoride reduces tooth decay – young or old, rich or poor, by contact and also by swallowing, regardless of diet.

The World Health Organisation has said that access to fluoride for dental health is a part of the basic human right to life.

The usual claims by the anti-fluoride lobby can be debunked with common sense and basic chemistry:

- Fluoride is a mineral, not a 'waste product', and highly purified from various natural sources.
- Fluoride ions dissociate freely in water regardless of the carrier mineral (sodium, silicate, calcium, etc.), so the carrier is immaterial.
- Referring to completely different chemical compounds containing fluorine atoms (as well as carbon, oxygen, hydrogen, phosphorus, etc) is entirely irrelevant to the debate.
- Fluoride captured in teeth or bone slowly turns over and the remainder is excreted (it does not continually accumulate).
- Some advanced countries supplement fluoride in table salt, where multiple water sources make water fluoridation impractical.
- Australia also supplements iodine in salt, vitamins A and D in margarine, and calcium, iron, thiamine and niacin in flour. Of course we also sanitise drinking water by adding chlorine.
- Every major city in Australia has adjusted fluoride levels in water.
- Anti-fluoride websites sell conventional water filters (which do not work because fluoride is dissolved).
- Fluoride does not damage the environment (there is even more fluoride in seawater).
- Fluoridating water simply tops-up the levels of naturally occurring fluoride in the water to strengthen teeth against tooth decay.

Those who suggest people should take fluoride tablets instead don't often realise that fluoride tablets are not as effective as fluoridated water and may increase the risk of dental fluorosis because there aren't stringent controls around the amount ingested.

Health experts are fed up with anti-fluoride claims based on outdated information, questionable research and biased opinions.

Water fluoridation has been practised around the world for more than 60 years and has been endorsed by the Australian Medical Association, World Health Organisation and American Academy of Paediatrics, and poses no known health risks to babies and young children.

Cooktown residents deserve a lifetime of healthy teeth.

Fluoride essential for dental health according to Chief Health Officer

Implementing fluoridisation in water is the most important way local governments can improve the dental health of their communities, according to Queensland's Chief Health Officer Dr Jeannette Young.

The Department of Health has written to every local government in Queensland, offering to meet and discuss the health benefits of fluoridation. Several local governments have taken up the offer and Dr Young is hopeful others will follow.

Recent changes to Queensland's legislation means local governments now have the decision-making power to determine if it is in the best interests of their communities to implement, continue or cease water fluoridation.

Dr Young said World Health Organisation studies showed adding fluoride to water supplies was a safe and effective way of reducing tooth decay.

She said fluoride was not harmful to people's health, despite the widespread scaremongering on the issue.

"In the small amounts that are used in water supplies, fluoride is not harmful," Dr Young said.

"There is no evidence to show fluoride, in the amounts used in water supplies, has any detrimental health effects.

"In fact, studies have shown that people with good dental health have better overall health.

"Townsville has been using fluoride in its water supplies since 1964 and it has not resulted in any health problems there.

"There is no reliable evidence of any adverse health effects to communities which have already implemented fluoride in their water supplies."

Queensland's Chief Dental Officer Dr Rhys Thomas said fluoride was proven to strengthen teeth and prevent rooth decay.

"Ultimately it is up to local authorities to implement and continue fluoridation. But we hope that they are making decisions armed with all the facts," Dr Thomas said.

"Studies have shown that the use of fluoride benefits everyone regardless of their age or access to dental care.

"Australian Child Dental Health surveys consistently show that Queensland children have levels of tooth decay well above the national average.







There are, of course, some logical links between the Energy and Water Supply portfolio but the kind of information you require would lie within the Health Department. The recent changes to empower councils in relation to fluoride was done in legislation that involved three combined portfolios – I recall lending my Parliament office to some really lovely Health Department staff as that part of the legislation was going through.

I have copied this email to Andrew Bibb who is the Backbench Liaison within Minister Springborg's office. He's a Senior Policy Advisor and very knowledgeable. I am sure he would be happy to assist you with your query.





Fluoridation Information Request – Mr Jason Woodforth MP, Member for Nudgee 12 February 2013

1. Safety Data / studies

The most recent National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) review in 2007 reaffirms the safety and effectiveness of water fluoridation. This extensive and rigorous review can be accessed at http://www.nhmrc.gov.au/guidelines/publications/eh41a. The 2007 NHMRC review concluded that "Fluoridation of drinking water remains the most effective and socially equitable means of achieving community-wide exposure to the caries prevention effects of fluoridae. It is recommended that water be fluoridated in the target range of 0.6 to 1.1 mg/L, depending on climate, to balance reduction of dental caries and occurrence of dental fluorosis".

The review specifically considered bone fractures, cancer and other possible adverse health effects associated with water fluoridation.

Bone fractures: The review concluded that "Water fluoridation at levels aimed at preventing dental caries has little effect on fracture risk. Fluoridation at 0.6 to 1.1 mg/L may lower overall fracture risk compared to both no fluoridation and fluoridation at levels well above those experienced in Australia".

Cancer: The NHMRC review highlights the findings of a previous systematic review of the safety and effectiveness of fluoridation undertaken by McDonagh et al (2000a) (This review is the UK National Health Service/University of York Review referred to in the next section). In this review it was concluded that there is no clear association between water fluoridation and overall cancer incidence or mortality (for 'all cause' cancer, and specifically for bone cancer and osteosarcoma). Furthermore, the authors state that the evidence relating fluoridation to cancer incidence or mortality is mixed, with small variations on either side of the effect.

The NHMRC review identified four additional studies undertaken since the completion of the York Review that were relevant for consideration. Three of the additional studies were ecological, the fourth was a matched case control study, undertaken by Bassin et al (2006). "The latter study compares the fluoride exposure of histologically-confirmed osteosarcoma cases with that of matched controls - a sub-set of patients from a larger case-control study initiated by the Harvard School of dental medicine that is yet to report its findings. After adjusting for significant differences at baseline between the cases and controls, the results of Bassin et al (2006) suggest an increased risk of osteosarcoma amongst young males (but not females) with water fluoridation. However, the attention of the reader is drawn to a letter to the editor by co-investigators of Bassin in which the letter authors point out that they have not been able to replicate these findings in the broader Harvard study, that included prospective cases from the same 11 hospitals. Furthermore, the bone samples that were taken in the broader study corroborate a lack of association between the fluoride content in drinking water and osteosarcoma in the new cases. The final publication of the full study is not yet available, and the authors of the letter caution readers not to overinterpret the results of Bassin and colleagues in the interim".

Since the publication of the NHMRC review in 2007, the broader Harvard osteosarcoma study has been published. It found no statistically significant association between water fluoridation and osteosarcoma. It should also be pointed out that a 2006 analysis of osteosarcoma in Australia by the Department of Health Services in Victoria and Cancer Council Victoria found that osteosarcoma rates in the largely non-fluoridated state of Queensland were actually higher than osteosarcoma rates in the other largely fluoridated states and territories, and double the Australian average. Osteosarcoma rates in largely non-fluoridated rural and regional Victoria were also significantly higher than osteosarcoma rates in fluoridated Melbourne. This information can be accessed at http://docs.health.vic.gov.au/docs/doc/4C66686838BC28DCCA257868007AD27C/SFILE/Osteosarcoma%202011 WEB.pdf

The NHMRC also considered other possible adverse health effects of water fluoridation. The review stated that "the authors of previous systematic reviews concluded that the studies examining other possible negative effects of water fluoridation provide insufficient evidence to reach a conclusion", and found no new evidence to change this view.

Other recent reviews on water fluoridation are the SCHER (European Commission) Review in 2010, the Irish Forum on Fluoridation in 2002 and the York Review of 2000. The SCHER Review found that "On reviewing the most recent studies, the SCHER concludes that epidemiological work does not indicate a clear link between fluoride in drinking water and any cancers. Nor is there evidence from animal studies to support such a link. Fluoride should therefore be classified as non-carcinogenic. The Irish Forum concluded that "The best available and most reliable scientific evidence indicates that at the maximum permitted level of fluoride in drinking water at 1 part per million, human health is not adversely affected". The York Review concluded that "An association with water fluoride and other adverse effects such as cancer, bone fracture and Down's syndrome was not found", although they added that "...we felt that not enough was known because the quality of the evidence was poor". 2. Effectiveness Data / studies (current dental decay rates Aust wide if they are available) and versus last 10-20 years

The 2007 NHMRC review concluded that "The existing body of evidence strongly suggests that water fluoridation is beneficial at reducing dental caries". The NHMRC also stated that "Fluoridation of drinking water remains the most effective and socially equitable means of achieving community-wide exposure to the caries prevention effects of fluoride. It is recommended that water be fluoridated in the target range of 0.6 to 1.1 mg/L, depending on climate, to balance reduction of dental caries and occurrence of dental fluorosis".

Australian Child Dental Health Surveys have been conducted since the early 1990s. Decay figures vary slightly from year to year depending on many variables, but consistently show Queensland children having higher levels of tooth decay than children in other states. For convenience, and because statistical analysis is more difficult when children have both primary (baby) and permanent (adult) teeth present together in the mouth, researchers usually record only primary tooth decay experience in 5-6 year olds (even if some permanent teeth have already erupted) and only permanent tooth decay experience in 12 year olds (even if some primary teeth are still present).

Fluoridation reduces smooth surface decay (predominantly decay between the teeth) more than pit and fissure decay (decay in the grooves of the chewing surfaces of the teeth). Early decay in the fissures is easier to record than decay in between teeth. Because no x-rays are used when recording these decay levels, it is likely that some decay between the teeth (occurring more commonly in non-fluoridated areas) is not recorded.

The interstate differences shown in these surveys are likely to underestimate the benefits of water fluoridation. Some children in other states will not have had exposure to water fluoridation, and many Queensland children will have had exposure to water fluoridation, either through living in Townsville or other fluoridated towns, or having lived part of their lives in other states. To address this concern, the 2002 Australian Child Dental Health Survey specifically looked at each child's exposure to water fluoridation.

After examining 136,000 children across Australia (all states and territories except NSW, which had a different system of examinations that could not easily be compared with other states and territories) and adjusting for exposure to water fluoridation, the 2002 Australian Child Dental Health Survey found that "Children from areas with higher concentrations of fluoride in drinking water had less dental decay than children from areas with low concentration of fluoride in drinking water, irrespective of whether they lived in metropolitan, rural or remote locations". The survey also concluded that "Water fluoridation was associated with better dental health, regardless of whether children lived in the least or most socioeconomically disadvantaged areas" and "Water fluoridation was associated with lower average levels of decayed, missing and filled teeth for each Australian state and territory were a comparison could be made". 3. Dental Fluorosis % risk - what is acceptable

Fluorides in drinking water, toothpaste and other sources can be responsible for both a reduction in dental caries and an increase in dental fluorosis. Dental fluorosis is a cosmetic effect that can range in appearance from scarcely discernible to a marked staining or pitting of the teeth in severe forms. Dental fluorosis occurs in both fluoridated and non-fluoridated areas, with a higher prevalence in fluoridated areas. The level of aesthetically concerning dental fluorosis rises sharply in those areas of the world with very high naturally occurring levels of fluoride in drinking water.

Prior to the introduction of water fluoridation in the United States in 1945, the National Institute of Dental Research conducted extensive studies of dental caries and dental fluorosis in areas with varying levels of naturally occurring fluoride in the drinking water. In 1942, H. T. Dean reported that "At a fluoride concentration of 1 mg/l about 20 percent of children have evidence of dental fluorosis but this fluorosis is of a mild degree of severity and would not be cosmetically obvious to the children or their parents". http://apps.who.int/iris/bitstream/10665/43514/1/9241563192 eng.pdf

In the current era, other factors also need to be considered. The ideal level of fluoride in drinking water is that which results in the maximum reduction in dental caries and a minimal increase in aesthetically concerning dental fluorosis. The ideal level in a particular area is usually determined after an assessment of other fluoride sources e.g. toothpaste, fluoride supplements, and the level of

fluoride naturally found in the water, and can also be influenced by the climate of the region. The Queensland Child Oral Health Survey is currently being conducted, and this will provide an accurate picture of the levels of tooth decay and dental fluorosis in Queensland, and their association with fluoridation.

Recent Australian research has led to techniques which can significantly reduce the impact of aesthetically concerning dental fluorosis.

It should be stressed that most fluorosis, if it occurs, is mild, is only detectable by a dentist, and does not damage the teeth. Tooth decay on the other hand is a destructive and disfiguring process, repair of which causes its own cosmetic problems, as well as pain, trauma, and significant financial cost.

4. Study (that is if one has ever been done?) hospital admission for serious illnesses of Townsville people versus rest of Qld

My Department is not aware of any study of this sort, and it is very unlikely that any study of this type has been carried out. There will certainly be information on hospital admissions for Townsville and the rest of Queensland, but no association between those admissions and water fluoridation could be made without asking all admitted patients about their exposure to water fluoridation. Other matters to consider are that until recently many parts of the wider Townsville region were not in fact fluoridated, and some of these areas are associated with high decay rates. Also, Townsville and other Queensland towns and cities may have transient populations, and it cannot be assumed that people from Townsville drink fluoridated water and people from the rest of Queensland do not. For example, the 1996 study that found significantly lower tooth decay rates in Townsville children drinking fluoridated water compared with Brisbane children drinking non-fluoridated water found that only around a third of Townsville children had actually lived all their life in the Townsville area. Many Queensland residents, particularly in the south-east corner of the state, will also have moved from other states and may have had significant exposure to fluoridated water prior to their arrival in Queensland.



Community water fluoridation relies for its effectiveness on long term community access to fluoridated water over many years.

Temporary interruptions to fluoride dosing can occur at any water treatment plant from time to time.

These temporary interruptions have no significant effect on oral health.

Council has advised that fluoride dosing was discontinued in response to an adverse worker health and safety audit recommendation.

Council complied with their statutory obligation to inform the Dept of Health that they had stopped fluoride dosing in July last year.



Under the Water Fluoridation Act there is no obligation on either the Council or Dept of Health to inform the community of temporary interruptions to fluoride dosing.

The Deptartment of Health is not involved in any investigation of worker health and safety at the Nebo Rd water treatment plant, but is following up the issue further with Council this week.





Fact Arthritis Australia has endorsed water fluoridation, stating that "Arthritis Australia is in favour of water fluoridation. There is no reputable scientific evidence that water fluoridation causes or worsens symptoms of arthritis".

Myth: Water fluoridation is banned in Europe

Fact No country has banned water fluoridation.

Fact Many countries use salt fluoridation as an alternative.

Myth: Fluoride dases bone fractures

Fact All Australian capital cities (except Brisbane) have been fluoridated for decades and have not seen an increase in bone fractures or other ill effects. Water fluoridation has been endorsed by Osteoporosis Australia.

Myth: Water fluoridation is bad for babies

Fact Water fluoridation has been endorsed by the World Health Organization. Australian Medical Association and American Academy of Pediatrics, and poses no known health risks for babies and young children.

Myth: Infant formula contains high levels of fluoride when mixed with fluoridated water

Fact Recent Australian studies show no link between the use of infant formulas and dental fluorosis.

Fluoridated water can be safely used to reconstitute infant formula.

Myth: Water fluoridation causes excessive dental fluorosis

Fact The only known side effect of optimal water fluoridation is a slight increase in dental fluorosis levels.

Fact Most fluorosis is barely detectable and does not damage the teeth, whereas tooth decay is painful, unsightly and expensive to repair.

Myth: Water fluoridation is mass medication

Fact The Department of Health does not consider the addition of fluoride to drinking water to be 'mass medication', but simply adjusting the level of a substance already found naturally in the water to provide a substantial public health benefit.

Q: What is fluoride?

A: Fluoride is a naturally occurring compound found in water, plants, rocks, soil, air and most foods.

Q: Why is fluoride added to the water?

A: While water supplies naturally contain some level of fluoride, there is not always sufficient fluoride to prevent tooth decay, especially when the water source comes from above the ground.

Q: What benefits could water fluoridation have for me and my family?

A: Water fluoridation helps to protect adults and children from tooth decay. It provides additional protection to fluoridated toothpaste. Preventing tooth decay can save your family the pain and discomfort of toothache and the expense required to treat the disease.

Q: Is water fluoridation poisonous?

A: No, water fluoridation is not poisonous. Anything can be dangerous at very high levels, but fluoride at less than one part per million is extremely safe.

Q: Does water fluoridation cause cancer or bone damage?

A: No, water fluoridation is not harmful, and numerous studies have found it does not cause cancer, osteoporosis, bone fractures or any other disease. Rates of any disease are no higher in fluoridated areas than in non fluoridated areas.

Q: Does water fluoridation cause allergic reactions?

A: No, water fluoridation has not been proven to cause any allergic reactions. Reviews by peak health bodies around the world have found no connection between water fluoridation and allergies, hypersensitivity or other immunological effects. Even sea water contains more fluoride than the levels in fluoridated water.

Q: Does water fluoridation affect the taste or smell of water?

A: No, fluoride does not affect the taste or smell of water.

Q: Does water fluoridation have any side effects?

A: Dental fluorosis or mottling of the teeth can occur if young children get too much fluoride when their adult teeth are forming. This condition effects only a small proportion of children and is associated with excess consumption of fluoride from all sources, especially toothpaste or fluoride supplements. Most fluorosis is mild and only detectable by a dentist.

Q: Is it possible for my family to drink too much fluoridated water?

A. Fluoridated water contains less than one part per million of fluoride. The level is set lower in Queensland than other areas of Australia because we need to drink more water due to our hotter climate. Because such a small amount of fluoride is used to top up natural levels, large amounts of water can be safely consumed.

Q:\ls\t fair to make everybody drink fluoridated water? Why don't people who want fluoride \tag{y} use fluoride supplements?

A: One of the advantages of water fluoridation is it allows all members of the community to benefit from the protective effects of fluoride, without cost or effort. Fluoride supplements do not provide the same benefit as water fluoridation.

Q: What if I really don't want it?

A: Those who choose not to benefit from water fluoridation can still choose other drinking water sources (e.g. bottled water, reverse osmosis filtered water).

Q: Will the Government be offering rebates for water filters?

A: The Government does not subsidise reverse osmosis water filters for those who choose not to access fluoridated water. Reverse osmosis systems are available from water filter retailers and selected hardware stores.

- Every year, around 2000 pre-schoolers need to be hospitalised for severe dental decay.

- The fluoridation of public water supplies has been practised around the world for more than sixty years; it is acknowledged as one of the 10 greatest public health achievements of the 20th century.
- A recent national review of water fluoridation found no negative health effects and only a slight increase in dental fluorosis.
- Water fluoridation gives extra protection against tooth decay but a healthy diet, regular brushing and flossing and regular dental check-ups are all essential for good oral health.
- More than 150 major health organisations including the World Health Organization, the Australian Medical Association (AMA), and the Australian Dental Association (ADA) support water fluoridation.

Anna Bligh has given her state something to smile about.

THREE cheers for Queensland Premier Anna Bligh, who has dragged the "Smart State" at least into the 20th century, committing to fluoridation.

For too long the state has been hostage to fearmongers and conspiracy theorists who, like General Jack D. Ripper in Dr Strangelove, think that "fluoridation is the most monstrously conceived and dangerous communist plot we have ever had to face".

Fluoride can occur naturally in water and has been added to water in the US since 1945 and in Australia since 1953 with no evidence of any ill-effects.

The benefits, however, are manifest.

Townsville, which has fluoridated water since the 1960s, has juvenile tooth decay rates 65 per cent lower than Brisbane, which does not.

The Department of Health is unaware of details of the fluoride supplement program previously undertaken by local Councils.

Fluoride supplements are not recommended for use in Australia.

In contrast to the evidence on the effectiveness of water fluoridation and fluoride toothpaste, fluoride supplements (tablets or drops) are largely ineffective as a public health measure due to low levels of compliance. Fluoride supplement use in pre-school years also increases the risk of developing dental fluorosis.



The aim of a 2007 NHMRC systematic review of fluoride and health was to synthesise high level evidence in relation to the efficacy and safety of different forms of fluoridation, with emphasis on those able to be delivered as a widespread public health initiative. Methods of fluoride delivery reviewed were water, milk, salt and topical agents such as toothpaste and gels, though the evidence for water fluoridation is the most extensive.

NHMRC Public Statement: The Efficacy and Safety of Fluoridation 2007

2013 Council consideration regarding the status of the Public Statement

NHMRC Council considered the NHMRC Public Statement on The Efficacy and Safety of Fluoridation at its meeting on 21 June 2013. Council reaffirmed its position that "Fluoridation of drinking water remains the most effective and socially equitable means of achieving community-wide exposure to the caries prevention effects of fluorida. It is recommended that water be fluoridated in the target range of 0.6 to 1.1 mg/L, depending on climate, to balance reduction of dental caries and occurrence of dental fluorosis".

Council recommended that the Office of the NHMRC update the body of evidence to include more recent studies and assess their relevance in the Australian context.

This follows advice received from an Expert Meeting held on 20 June 2013 on water fluoridation, which included jurisdictional representatives and a range of technical experts.



Presenter Background for 'Dental Update 2013'

Keynote Presenter:

Emeritus Professor Colin Dawes obtained an honours degree (B.Sc.) in physiology and a degree (B.D.S.) in dental surgery from Manchester University and a Ph.D. in oral physiology from the University of Durham under the supervision of Prof. Neil Jenkins. His postdoctoral work was with Prof. James H. Shaw of Harvard University. Subsequent academic appointments were at the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, where he is currently Professor Emeritus. An May 2013 he received the prestigious Distinguished Service Award from the Canadian Dental Association, The award recognises outstanding contributions to the dental procession and the dental community. Professor Dawes has carried out research on many aspects of saliva, including the factors influencing its flow rate and composition. He developed a now well-accepted model of salivary clearance and was the first to recognise that saliva in the mouth forms a thin film of average thickness < 0.1 mm. He developed methods of estimating the film velocity in different regions of the mouth and postulated its role in xerostomia and in the site-specificity of dental caries, calculus deposition and erosion. He has also collaborated in the development of mathematical and physical modelling of the diffusion of materials between the salivary film and dental plaque. He has published over 220 scientific articles, given over 215 invited lectures in 27 different countries, and was the Editor of the Journal of Dental Research from 1983-93.

Professor Laurence Walsh is Professor of Dental Science at the University of Queensland School of Dentistry and is a specialist in special needs dentistry. Professor Walsh has published and presented widely at national and international levels. He has played a leading role in developing and assessing new clinical techniques in the areas of laser surgery, accelerated bleaching, and treatments for reversing tetracycline stains and white spot lesions.

Associate Professor David Thomson was the Federal President of the Australian Dental Association 2000-02, Australian Council of Professions President 2005-07 and a Councillor for the FDI World Dental Federation 2003-08. He completed his BDSc at the University of Queensland in 1970 and his Masters in Dental Science in the field of Prosthodontics. He was a Visiting Professor, Northwestern University Chicago 1979-80. He has been a registered specialist Prosthodontist since 1983 with a private practice on Wickham Terrace in Brisbane. He has been involved in teaching both to undergraduate and post-graduate students at the UQ Dental School on a part-time basis since 1984. Since 2004 he has been an Associate Professor at the University of Queensland Dental School with responsibilities for third and fourth year prosthodontics. He gained fellowship in the RACDS in 1981 and MRACDS (Pros) 2008 and was the College president 2004 - 06. He is also a fellow of the International College of Dentists, Academy of Dentistry International and the Pierre Fauchard Academy With this involvement he still manages a private prosthodontic practice with interests in all aspects of contemporary dental practice.


Professor Ian Meyer's is currently in general dental practice in Brisbane, Australia and has honorary professorial positions with The University of Queensland School of Dentistry, and James Cook University School of Medicine and Dentistry. Ian has worked in both public and private dental clinics and has been involved with The University of Queensland over two decades. He was the 2010 President of the Queensland Branch of the Australian Dental Association. He is a product consultant to a range of dental companies and has been a member and chairman of the ADA Dental Instruments, Materials and Equipment Committee. He is a member of the International Association

for Dental Research, Chairman of the Australian Dental Research Foundation and a member of the editorial board of The Australian Dental Journal and several other international journals. He is a member of the Board of Studies, and chairman of the Examinations Committee, for the MRACDS program. His major interests include adhesive restorative dental materials, diagnosis and management of the worn dentition, minimum intervention dentistry, and teaching and clinical development in general practice dentistry.

Professor Hien Ngo has extensive experience in private practice, research and education. He was the principal of a dental practice located in the business district of Adelaide for 18 years. As a researcher, he is active in the areas of dental materials and cariology. As an educator, he has published and lectured extensively internationally on dental materials, minimal intervention dentistry and cariology. He was instrumental to the establishment of the "Minimal Intervention" concept at several dental schools in Australia and Asia. He has recently been invited to join the Kuwait University to lead the implementation of Minimal Intervention to this part of the world.

Associate Professor Alex Moule is a specialist endodontist with over 25 years experience in endodontic practice. Before moving to Kuwait University, he was the principal of a large endodontic practice with branches in Brisbane, Toowoomba and the Gold Coast. He is registered as a specialist endodontist in Australia and in the United Kingdom. He is a past president of the Australian and New Zealand Academy of Endodontists and a member of the Australian Society of Endodontology for 35 years. Prior to his move into private practice Alex taught dentistry both internationally and in Australia. He completed his Doctor of Philosophy degree in 1979. He holds Associate Professorship positions at both Kuwait University and the University of Queensland. He is still active in dental research and was the founder and coordinator of the Brisbarie Endodontic Research Group, Foundation Chairman of the Australian Society of Endodoritology Research Grants committee and until recently chairman of Australian Society of Endodontology Teachers Committee. He has supervised numerous research theses at a number of universities and has published one book and over 40 refereed research publications. Alex is currently a Director of the International Association of Dental Traumatology, an international body dedicated to the teaching of Dental Traumatology worldwide. His standing in the dental community has been recognized by the award of International Fellowships including the International College of Dentists, the Academy of Dentistry International and the Pierre Fauchard Society. He is an active member of several international editorial advisory committees including the Journal of Endodontics and the International Endodontic Journal. For many years he was on the Editorial Board of the Australian Endodontic Journal.

- We're waiting for a sign off from the Premier on a brief on fluoride projects. To enable Councils to cease / delay fluoride projects, there would need to be changes to regulation / legislation.
- However, there are a couple of directions already:
 - o If the project has substantially progressed, it is likely that it will be required to proceed to completion (eg Doomadgee Council).
 - o If the project is not commenced, the Premier will consider allowing the Council to explore other options (eg Maranoa Regional Council).
- Suggest at this time that individual Councils need to write to the Premier, providing details of the progress
 they have made toward finalising fluoridation arrangements, and seeking advice on the way forward.



Hi Mark,

The Department no longer recommends the routine use of fluoride supplements for the general population for the following reasons:

- the beneficial effect of fluoride is predominately topical, not systemic. That is, the beneficial effect
 is the result of the fluoride ion coming into direct contact with the surface of the teeth rather than
 the ingestion of fluoride;
- unlike water fluoridation, the use of fluoride supplements is associated with infrequent topical application, thereby limiting their effectiveness;
- those who take fluoride supplements regularly are rarely in the high risk groups for developing dental caries;
- long term compliance for those who are at higher risk of developing dental caries is poor; and
- in the United States fatalities have resulted from children consuming an overdose of fluoride tablets.

It is acknowledged that fluoride tablets are now very difficult to purchase because, due to the low demand nationally, suppliers and manufacturers do not see it commercially viable to make fluoride tablets available in Australia. If in a specific case the use of fluoride supplements is recommended, the dental professional should be able to source a product for the individual patient from a compounding pharmacy. The Professional Compounding Chemists of Australia Pty Ltd are also able to provide contact details for compounding pharmacies nationally and can be contacted toll free on 1300 722 269.

PREMIER:	

Ladies and gentlemen it's great to be here today at the South Bank parklands with Lord Mayor Graham Quirk to finalise a memoranda of understanding which will see the control of the Southbank area going across to the Brisbane City Council. So, planning and development assessment powers will go back to the council for this precinct but the council will also be taking over the management of the parklands component of the South Bank area to manage it appropriately for the people of Brisbane and the people of Queensland. It's the appropriate way for the parklands to be run because the BCC do a fantastic job of running parks and gardens right across the city. This also will be the case with the Roma St Parklands as well. The background ladies and gentlemen is that back in 1992 during the second reading speech, then Premier Wayne Goss indicated that there would come a point where the work of the corporation in developing this land would be complete and that the planning and development assessment powers should go back to the BCC. In a sense, he was saying that one day the corporation will have done its job and the BCC then should take on that responsibility. The other thing that I say today is that our government's agenda is about local empowerment. Wherever possible this government is giving out authority and responsibility and resources, whether it be to councils and the changes that we've made to the Local Government Act and the City of Brisbane Act, or to, for example, local hospital health boards, so that local communities can be in charge of their own destiny. This decision and this signing today is totally consistent with that. I am very, very confident the Lord Mayor and his team will do an excellent job in running this great precinct here at Southbank, but also the precinct over at Roma St and I know ultimately it's a better outcome for taxpayers and ratepayers. In terms of the deal, just to give you a bit of a feel at this stage.

essentially it's just that the funding that the State Government is currently spending is about ten million budgeted a year. That will be going across to the BCC to do the job but the BCC will do that job for Queenslanders. Lord Mayor.

LORD MAYOR:

Yeah thanks very much Premier. Well we've reached a point where we have an agreement around a way forward for South Bank and Roma St Parklands and as the Premier said I think there is a win/win outcome in this. There will be I think some savings to be made for the state. There'll also be some opportunities through innovation for Brisbane City Council as well. So essentially, how it will work, is that we will look after the maintaining and operations of the parklands here but the state will retain the ownership of the residential, the retail and commercial aspects of South Bank. In terms of this area, though, as the Premier said, we will look after the Parklands. It's the sort of things that local government does best. We will be transferring the staff from both Roma St Parklands and South Bank over to council though the first twelve months of that transfer will be retention of their existing arrangements with the state awards. They will then come on to...as part of the EBA of Brisbane City Council and I just say to those staff firstly that, of course by coming across to council you join an organisation that will not just be looking after South Bank and Roma St but indeed thousands of parks across the city including botanic gardens and the like. So there'll be opportunities for those staff if they want to go beyond even the looking after of South Bank and Roma St Parklands as an opportunity for them. But this is an opportunity for, as I say, state taxpayers and Brisbane City Council ratepayers to gain an advantage out of this arrangement by both doing what we do best.

REPORTER:

So what's going to happen to the Southbank Corporation?

LORD MAYOR:

Well the corporation as it is will cease to exist. But there may be some overviewing body and that is something that Council is currently looking at to determine how that might work. But certainly the large scale corporation that did exist in terms of a board arrangement, that will cease.

REPORTER:

And the ten million dollars a year, is that going to cover cost, or is council going to have to stump up some extra money to help manage the buffer?

LORD MAYOR:

Well, look it's going to be done by an open book arrangement, so Ernst & Young are engaged. They will be over viewing the operations in the first 12 months. That will, as I say, provide an open book arrangement so the rate payers are not out of pocket and it will mean that we will, through innovation, again be able to obtain some savings. See one of the things with Southbank also, and indeed with Roma Street Parklands, is we will get Brisbane Marketing also engaged. We think that there are some further opportunities for activation and that on this site. And there is again share arrangement that can apply both to the rate payers of Brisbane and the tax payers of Queensland. That's where we will get some uplift, and by again, doing what we do best in terms of park maintenance, maintaining as a minimum the standard the exists here, both here at Southbank and indeed at Roma Street Parklands at the same time.

REPORTER:

Can you guarantee rate payers won't be out of pocket?

LORD MAYOR:

Yes I can.

REPORTER:

Will rate payers be up for any more costs in this agreement given the fact that Council has taken over?

LORD MAYOR:

No, we won't be up for any more costs because the arrangements are that we will paid an operating fee, and that fee will be an open book where we will show our costs to the State, and that will be overseen by Ernst & Young as an over viewing body. And so that is where we are at. That's why we've got a situation where we will not be out of pocket, as the rate payers of the council, the Brisbane City Council, but equally the State has some opportunities for savings and some uplift through innovation.

REPORTER:

State matters, Premier?

PREMIER:

So, we're finished with Roma Street? State matters, yes, over to you.

REPORTER:

The inquiry into the Health payroll debacle before Christmas, what's your intention there, is it going to a full blown commission or what?

PREMIER:

Well look, I'm not in a position to actually make any announcement today. I say to you, watch this space. We have had a lot of feedback from Queenslanders who are saying 'don't let this one be swept under the carpet. You have to open and transparently enquire in to how 1.2 billion dollars of tax payer funds were wasted,' Queenslanders are saying they want they answers to we are responding to that. And as soon as we can, we will make an announcement on that.

REPORTER:

What's the sticking point [inaudible], are you [inaudible] witnesses?

PREMIER:

Well, look at this stage I am just not in a position yet to actually let people know. I just assure Queenslanders that we will not be sweeping this under the carpet. We are determined to get to the bottom of how 1.2 billion dollars was wasted.

REPORTER:

Clearly there will be a cost involved in that though Premier. Is that just a price that has to be paid?

PREMIER:

Well that's obviously something we are weighing up and that is why I am not in a position yet to talk about any outcome or way forward. But I just assure people we will not let this go. We will not let it be swept under the carpet.

REPORTER:

How long before we could be seeing a decision?

PREMIER:

I am hoping that we can make a decision certainly before Christmas.

REPORTER:

The follow up to the Costello Report, when are we going to see that?

PREMIER:

Ah look, my understanding is that a draft has been provided to the Treasurer I haven't seen it yet and as soon as we can we will be releasing that.

REPORTER:

If there is the implication there that there is room for more public service cuts, is that something you are open to?

PREMIER:

I have said very clearly that the announced changes that we've made and the cost savings we've had to implement are the extent of what we will be doing.

REPORTER:

You can guarantee there'll be no more?

PREMIER:

Well, that's what I've said. Absolutely. That's our position. That's what we said at the time of the budget that we had to make hard decisions, but they would be the decisions. And then we can get the state back on track. I'll make the point, ladies and gentlemen, that we are probably at least 55-60% through that very difficult and traumatic process, but it is proceeding and proceeding in the way that we said. And it is delivering the savings that will ultimately get this state back in the black in two years-time.

REPORTER:

What sort of feedback have you had from councils about the fluoride issue?

PREMIER:

Well, I haven't had any yet, directly to me, other than, honestly, I had the Tablelands Council write to me some weeks ago saying they didn't want to implement it up there. Just on fluoride, here's the government's position: We totally, unequivocally support the fluoridation of water across Queensland and we would urge councils to have fluoridation programs. But consistent with our policy as a government of local empowerment, we believe that one size fits all, big brother approaches from Brisbane are not the way to go

and that is why this government believes this and other decisions are best placed in local hands. But again, we urge councils to either implement fluoridation or certainly maintain it if they've already got it.

REPORTER:

Mr Woodforth clearly has quite extreme views on it. Are you happy for him to keep speaking publicly?

PREMIER:

Well, contrary to some of the nonsense that's spoken about, sort of, my team and I on occasions, I actually don't mind a debate and I don't mind people airing their views. I don't agree with him. Neither do the team, I believe. There might be some people who have the same views, but if he wants to express an opinion, that's fine by me. But, I don't agree...

REPORTER:

He says it's more than a few of your team that agree with him.

PREMIER:

Well, that's his opinion.

REPORTER:

Is he wrong?

PREMIER:

Well, I don't believe that's the case. Absolutely. And I believe there is strong support across the Queensland community. Any poll that's ever taken shows that people strongly support fluoridation and I make the point that you'd be hard-pressed to find people who would say we're using non-fluoridated toothpaste. Now, that's really the proof of the pudding. All the toothpaste we buy in the supermarket, ladies and gentlemen, is fluoridated. It's very hard to find stuff that isn't, so if you then think about that for a moment, it actually is rather a sobering reality.

REPORTER:

Are you likely to allow councils then to decide on something like daylight savings, whether they should have them?

PREMIER:

No, of course not. How would that work Sarah Vogler? Courier Mail. This is a novel...

REPORTER:

Seventy-three different time zones, I think is a really good...

PREMIER:

More specifically, the amendments will permit:

All Local Governments that are yet to implement fluoridation to decide whether or not this should occur in the best interests of the communities within their local government area;

local governments that are currently fluoridating their water supplies to cease doing so; or local governments that are currently fluoridating their water supplies to continue to do so.

Where fluoridation continues, or commences in the future, all existing legislated provisions to ensure safe fluoridation will remain.

These amendments will result in consequential amendments to other sections of the Act and the removal of Schedule 1 of the Water Fluoridation Regulation 2008, which currently specifies the implementation dates for each water supply.

The amendments will also abolish the Queensland Fluoridation Committee, as its role to advise the Minister on the merits of exemption applications will no longer be required.

Local Governments that are yet to implement fluoridation of the their drinking water supplies that wish to proceed with fluoridation will still be able to access the Queensland Fluoridation Capital Assistance Program funding to cover up to 100% of eligible capital costs.

This funding is administered by the Department of State Development, Infrastructure and Planning and is available until 30 June 2014.

Those Local Governments that have, up to now, invested in drinking water fluoridation infrastructure in good faith and that subsequently determine it is not in the best interests of a community to continue fluoridation may be able to claim eligible capital costs back from the Queensland Fluoridation Capital Assistance Program.



Thank you for your letter of insert text regarding the fluoridation of insert text.

The Government has decided to re-establish a role for local authorities in the decision making process and has introduced amendments into Parliament to give back control of fluoridation to local authorities and their constituents.


These changes will mean that communities which are still considering options for fluoride treatment will decide for themselves if, and when to, proceed. This reflects the Government's strong commitment to local decision-making and I am confident will lead to greater accountability of local councils to the communities they serve. The amendments to the legislation also make absolutely clear that water suppliers must either fluoridate or cease fluoridating in accordance with the decision of the local council.

It will be important for local councils to fully understand the cost implications of their decisions and communicate this with local residents so an informed decision can be reached. It will be up to the local council to pay costs incurred by a water supplier in complying with the local council's decision. In cases where several councils are supplied by a single water entity, as is the case in South East Queensland, councils that choose to cease fluoridating their water supply will have to bear the full cost of removing themselves from that particular network.

The Government will work closely with councils to support informed debate and decision making at the local level. We will also continue to provide funding for fluoride infrastructure for those councils opting to proceed with fluoridation until 2014. More broadly, the Government continues to endorse fluoride treatment, given the undisputed dental health benefits it brings, and I am pleased that around 87 per cent of Queenslanders have fluoride in their local water supplies. However we have listened to people from all parts of Queensland and the changes we have made will give local councils and their constituents the chance to make their own decisions.
